Happy Spring! We are almost to the end of the year! Thank you for your patience in this crazy time of the covid pandemic. Remember to keep your students home if they are not feeling well. We have done well with mask wearing, social distancing, and washing our hands. Keep up the good work!

Parents, all medications will need to be picked up by Thursday, May 20, 2021 no later than 3:15 pm. Students are not allowed to pick these up. We DO NOT keep medications of any kind over the summer months and these will be destroyed on Friday, May 21, per school district policy. This includes prescription medications, inhalers, cough drops, liquid medications, lotions, eye drops etc. Also, make sure to pick up any other supplies that might be in the health office. If you have a special need or concern, please call the health office.

Spring and summer are great times to get any immunizations that your student might be missing. If you received a letter of notice for missing shots, you can take that to the doctor or health department for administration of these vaccinations. If you have lost or misplaced it, we will be happy to get you a new one! Remember to bring in the updated immunization information next fall. There may be some changes concerning exemptions, so please look for that information to be sent to you if you have signed an exemption letter in the past.




