PSAT/SAT Fact Sheet

On the days when my student will be testing, what time should they be at school?

Your student should arrive at school no later than 7:50am as testing will begin promptly at 8am in assigned classrooms on campus. It will be critical for your student to be at their testing station on time to receive the group instructions required for each test. (PLEASE carefully note the calendar dates above).

Do buses run on the testing days?

Buses will run on a regular schedule arriving to and from FMHS. When students have completed their tests, they are free to leave campus. Buses will leave FMHS at 3:26pm.

Will the Career Center and WCCC still be having classes during the test period?

The Career Center will NOT be holding classes on April 13 and 14. WCCC will be having classes on both days and students can attend those classes on any day they are not testing. The buses will also run for all these students at regular times.

Will all high schools be testing on the same dates?

All four high schools will be testing on Wednesday and Thursday, April 13 and 14.

If I don't want my student to take a test, what do I do?

Parents who wish to refuse state testing will be required to fill out the Parent Request for Exemption form which is located on the Assessment Information website and bring it into their student's school. Click here for the link to the <u>Assessment Information for Parents</u> form. One form per student must be completed and returned by the **parent** to the student's school.

If my student is not scheduled to take a test, should they come to school?

No. In order to properly administer each exam, we will be utilizing all staff to proctor exams and must maintain a testing environment. Teachers will not be available and the library and computer labs will be in use.

Class of 2022 FMHS Hall of Fame Inductees:

Fruita Monument High School and the Fruita Monument Hall of Fame Committee are proud to announce the inductees for our Hall of Fame Class of 2022. Inductees were honored at a presentation during halftime of the Fruita Monument vs Central Boys basketball game on February 4, 2022.



Phil Wertman – Phil Wertman dedicated his entire life to sports, from his childhood in Villisca, lowa to his retirement here in the Grand Valley.

Wertman played football, basketball, and baseball at Villisca Community High School as well as participating in track and band, and he graduated with a long list of medals to show for it.

Wertman's resume includes ten state titles, five regional championships and one two time Collegiate All American during his time at FMHS all while impacting the lives of countless students for life beyond Fruita from 1978-2005.



John Kohls From 1980 to 1983, Kohls dominated on the football field and wrestling mat. As a senior, Kohls was named All-Southwestern League offensive lineman and was a mainstay on a football team that went 9-3 winning the Southwest League before advancing to the 3A Semi-finals.

During the wrestling season, the team went on to capture the SWL title and finish second in Class 3A. Kohls went undefeated and took the individual state title in the 155lbs weight class. He was also selected to the All-State team, and the All-State Duel, which he won. Kohls was also chosen as the Southwestern League Outstanding Wrestler. He went on to compete in wrestling at BYU competing all 4 years in NCAA Nationals.



Bart Bortles - From 1961 - 64, Bart proved to be one of the most versatile athletes in Fruita's long history. Bortels lettered in five sports including baseball, football, wrestling, basketball and track.

After graduating, Bart went on to play football at the University of Colorado as an offensive guard where he lettered and was a starter on the Big 8 powerhouse.

Class of 2022 FMHS Hall of Fame Inductees (cont.):



Lanny Paulson - As a stellar student/athlete from 1977-1979, Lanny Paulson represented FMHS with the traits we value as a community.

Paulson excelled in the classroom, on the wrestling mat and baseball field. As a senior wrestler, Paulson was named the Southwestern League Most Valuable Wrestler and went undefeated giving up only five points to his opponents the entire season. During that season, Paulson captured the Class 3A title with an overtime victory at 155lbs and helped his team claim the Southwestern League title and a second place finish in Class 3A. Paulson went on to wrestle at the collegiate level for the Uni-

versity of Utah for a year and finishing up at the University of Northern Colorado.



Dan Miller - Dan Miller's career has been marked by a true and undying passion for athletics. Miller graduated from high school in 1965, earning 14 varsity letters (four in football, track, and baseball, and two in basketball).

After high school, Dan went on to become a Junior College All-American in 1966. Following college, he coached wrestling at Michigan high school and, after winning two state runner-up titles, he was named coach of the year for his class in 1975. Miller earned his masters degree and completed multiple exams to become one of the first Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialists (CSCS) in the country. This qualification, similar to a PhD at the time, immersed him in the leading weight training techniques, including Olympic-style weightlifting.

At FMHS, he pioneered the weight and conditioning program, working with student-athletes across multiple sports. He served as an assistant football coach from 1976 to 2002, seeing four semi-final and two state runner-up teams during his career. Additionally, he helped train two state champion women's basketball teams, as well as baseball, softball, wrestling, and men's basketball state champion teams.



Don Paris - Don Paris, a 1965 graduate, was regarded by his classmates as a, "Power Packed Bundle of Brawn," in the Fruita HIgh School Yearbook.

Paris not only dominated on the football field, basketball court and baseball field, he was a tremendous student and was loved by his peers.

Paris not only lettered all four years in football, basketball, and baseball - he earned All-Conference honors in football three times and basketball twice. He also received honorable mention as an All American in Football. As captain of the football team in his senior season, Donny helped lead the Wildcats to a 12-1 record, the Gunnison Valley League title and a playoff run that ended with a loss in the Class 2A State Finals in his senior year. At the close of

the season Paris earned the "FHS Outstanding Player Award". He was also a member of the 1965 baseball team that captured the Gunnison Valley League title and finished as class 2A State Runner-ups.

Paris's talents earned him a four-year football scholarship to the University of Colorado. However, due to injuries, he was only able to play for one season. However, his skill and determination in sports and life were an inspiration to many.




