#### On the days when my student will be testing, what time should they be at school?

Your student should arrive at school no later than 7:50am as testing will begin promptly at 8am in assigned classrooms on campus. It will be critical for your student to be at their testing station on time to receive the group instructions required for each test. (PLEASE carefully note the calendar dates above).

#### Do buses run on the testing days?

Buses will run on a regular schedule arriving to and from FMHS. When students have completed their tests, they are free to leave campus. Buses will leave FMHS at 3:26pm.

#### Will the Career Center and WCCC still be having classes during the test period?

The Career Center will NOT be holding classes on April 13 and 14. WCCC will be having classes on both days and students can attend those classes on any day they are not testing. The buses will also run for all these students at regular times.

#### Will all high schools be testing on the same dates?

All four high schools will be testing on Wednesday and Thursday, April 13 and 14.


#### If I don't want my student to take a test, what do I do?

Parents who wish to refuse state testing will be required to fill out the Parent Request for Exemption form which is located on the Assessment Information website and bring it into their student's school. #### If my student is not scheduled to take a test, should they come to school?

No. In order to properly administer each exam, we will be utilizing all staff to proctor exams and must maintain a testing environment. Teachers will not be available and the library and computer labs will be in use.

#### From the Health Office-

It's hard to believe that we are at the end of another great school year! We want to send off on summer break with a few reminders:

\*Parents, all medications will need to be picked up by Thursday, May 19, no later than 3:00 pm. Students are not allowed to pick these up. We DO NOT keep medications of any kind over the summer months and these will be destroyed on Thursday, May 19 after 3:00pm, per school district policy. This includes prescription medications, inhalers, cough drops, liquid medications, lotions, eye drops etc. Also, make sure to pick up any other supplies that might be in health office. If you have a special need or concern, please call the health office.

\*Spring and summer are great times to get any immunizations that your student might be missing. If you received a letter of notice for missing shots, you can take that to the doctor or health department for administration of these vaccinations. If you lost or misplaced it, we will be happy to get you a new one! Remember to bring in the updated immunization information next fall. There are some changes concerning exemptions. If your student has a personal or religious exemption for immunizations that are requied by Colorado State Law, a new exemption will need to be completed after June 30, 2022. A completed form is now requied yearly.
