



From the Health Office --

It's hard to believe that we are at the end of another great school year! We want to send you off on summer break with a few reminders:

*Parents, all medications will need to be picked up by Thursday, May 19, no later than 3:00 pm. Students are not allowed to pick these up. We DO NOT keep medications of any kind over the summer months and these will be destroyed on Thursday, May 19 after 3:00pm, per school district policy. This includes prescription medications, inhalers, cough drops, liquid medications, lotions, eye drops etc. Also, make sure to pick up any other supplies that might be in the health office. If you have a special need or concern, please call the health office.

*Spring and summer are great times to get any immunizations that your student might be missing. If you received a letter of notice for missing shots, you can take that to the doctor or health department for administration of these vaccinations. If you have lost or misplaced it, we will be happy to get you a new one! Remember to bring in the updated immunization information next fall. There are some changes concerning exemptions. If your student has a personal or religious exemption for immunizations that are required by Colorado State Law, a new exemption will need to be completed after June 30, 2022. A completed form is now required yearly. If you have any question or would like more information, please contact the health office at FMHS or go online at:
