- Photo ID

For <u>Science CMAS</u>, Remember to Bring:

- Your <u>charged</u> Chromebook (if you have not used it this semester, please stop by the library before 4/10 to make sure that it is updated)
- Pencil
- Photo ID

What NOT to Bring:

- A cell phone or other electronic devices
- Highlighters, pens, or mechanical pencils
- Books or papers of any kind
- A timer with an audible alarm

PSAT/SAT Fact Sheet

On the days when my student will be testing, what time should they be at school?

Your student should arrive at school no later than 8 am. It will be critical for your student to be at their testing station on time to receive the group instructions required for each test. **PLEASE carefully note the calendar dates above.**

Do buses run on the testing days?

Buses will run on a regular schedule arriving to and from FMHS. When students have completed their tests, they are free to leave campus. Buses will leave FMHS at 3:26 pm.

Will the Career Center and WCCC still be having classes during the test period?

The Career Center will NOT be holding classes on April 12 and 13. WCCC will be having classes on both days and students can attend those classes on any day they are not testing. The buses will also run for all these students at regular times.

Will all high schools be testing on the same dates?

All four high schools will be testing on Wednesday and Thursday, April 12 and 13.

If I don't want my student to take a test, what do I do?

Parents who wish to refuse state testing will be required to fill out the <u>Parent Request for Exemption Form</u> and bring it to the FMHS Main Office. We are not allowed to accept the form in an email, a photocopy of the form, or via a parent phone call. The original form must be turned in with the parent's signature. **Deadline for opting out is on March 31**.

If my student is not scheduled to take a test, should they come to school?

No. In order to properly administer each exam, we will be utilizing all staff to proctor exams and must maintain a testing environment. Teachers will not be available and the library and computer labs will be in use.

What happens if my student gets ill and is not able to attend the testing session?

Students who miss the regular testing sessions will be automatically rescheduled to participate in the make-up sessions on the following dates:

- PSAT 10 Wednesday, April 26
- SAT Tuesday, April 25
- Science CMAS Tuesday, April 18

Health Office Announcement

From the Health Office --

It's hard to believe that we are at the end of another great school year! We want to send you off on summer break with a few reminders:

*Parents, all medications will need to be picked up by Tuesday, May 23, no later than 12:00 pm. Students are not allowed to pick these up. We DO NOT keep medications of any kind over the summer months and these will be destroyed on Tuesday, May 23 after 3:00pm, per school district policy. This includes prescription medications, inhalers, cough drops, liquid medications, lotions, eye drops etc. Also, make sure to pick up any other supplies that might be in the health office. If you have a special need or concern, please call the health office.

*Spring and summer are great times to get any immunizations that your student might be missing. If you received a letter of notice for missing shots, you can take that to the doctor or health department for administration of these vaccinations. If you have lost or misplaced it, we will be happy to get you a new one! Remember to bring in the updated immunization information next fall. There are some changes concerning exemptions. If your student has a personal or religious exemption for immunizations that are required by Colorado State Law, a new exemption will need to be completed after June 30, 2023. 




