



Community Art

For those of you that are new to FMHS, for the last 15 years, we have built a large piece of art for display in our building. The piece is built by the FMHS students, faculty, families, and community members. This year we are working with Students Rebuild and participating in the "Extraordinary Earth" project. https://www.studentsrebuild.org/ challenges/earth. For each piece of art we make and add to our big community piece we raise \$5 to help educate people on the climate crisis and what it is doing to our environment. The title for this year's piece is "Anthropogenic Garden, What you Do Matters". The design team has chosen to create a tree-like structure and then is asking people to attend work sessions after school or on a Saturday to create butterflies, dragon flies, bees, flowers, leaves, vines,...etc. out of recycled materials, to cover the structure. We provide all of the materials. We also have patterns and coloring sheets available to use if someone needs them. People of all ages and art abilities are welcome to join in the fun. We will have a work space setup during Student Support Times, in the library, starting 1/31 and running through 2/29 for students to come create. We would love to have clubs, teams, individuals, families..... whomever, come to an after school work session or a Saturday session to make something we can add to the base. Our Swim Team is working hard and has Regionals coming up in February.




